Top ten rules for saving energy

1. Turn off the lights, turn off the TV, computer, video games and other electrical stuff when you leave the room.
2. Adjust the thermostat during the winter.
3. Don't leave the refrigerator door open. Every time you open the door, up to one-third of the cold air can escape.
4. Replace a burnt-out light bulb with a new compact fluorescent bulb. Fluorescent bulbs use 75 percent less energy, and they last 10 times longer.
5. Remind the adult to use cold water in the washing machine. Hot water won't get the clothes any cleaner, and it wastes a lot of energy.
6. Fix dripping taps. One drop per second can add up to 165 gallons of hot water a month - that's more than one person uses in two weeks!
7. Take a short shower instead of a long bath. It might take 25 litres of hot water to fill the bath, compared to only seven litres for a quick shower.
8. Close the curtains during hot summer days to block the sun. During the winter, keep the curtains open.
9. Help an adult put plastic sheeting on windows. Blocking cold drafts is called "weatherising" and it can save a lot of energy.
10. Help your mum or dad plant a tree to help shade your house on hot summer days.
