

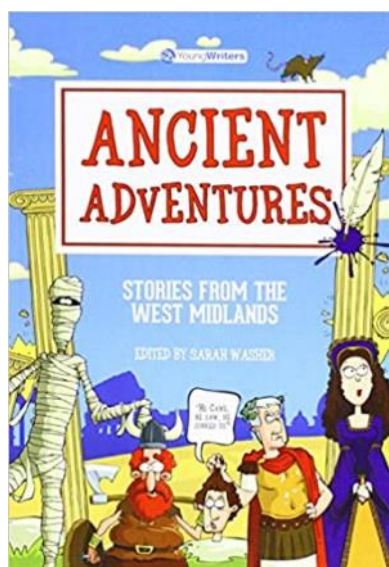

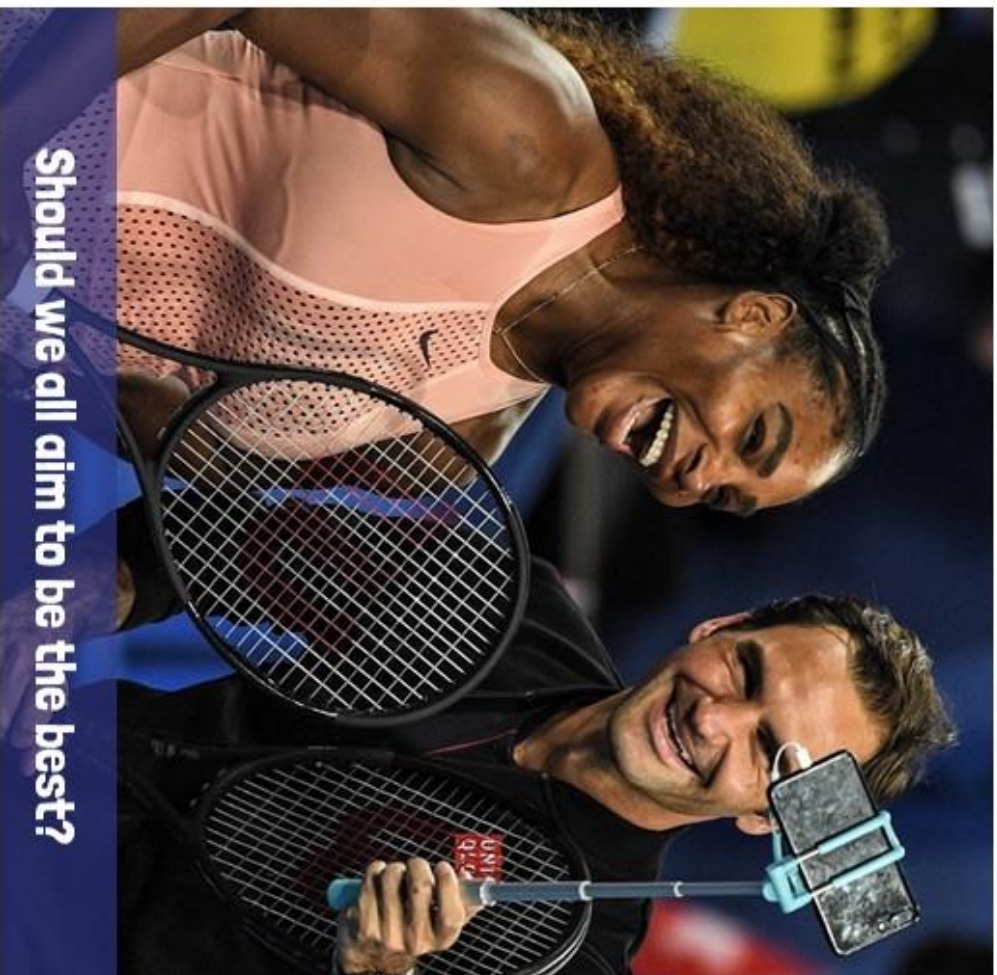


In the news this week
