For this reason, we also ask that parents and guardians are warned against purchasing electric scooters over the Christmas period as they run the risk of being fined and the vehicle being seized by the police.

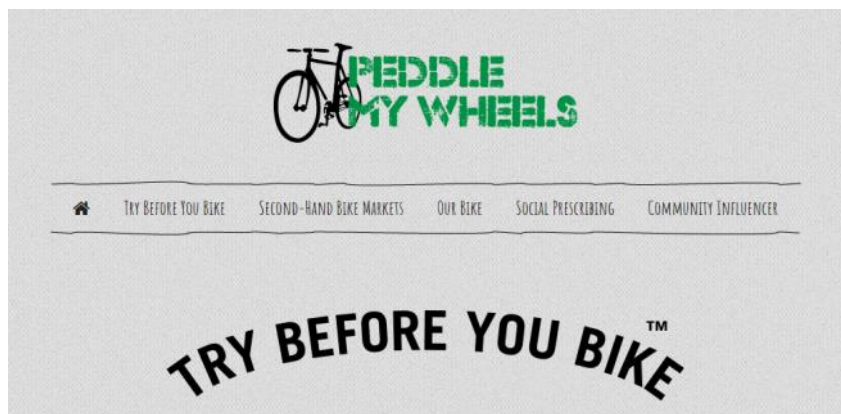
Miss Hughes dressed up as Cindy Lou Who, from The Grinch! She was also the winner of the 2nd place prize Christmas hamper.

## In the news this week

### Things to talk about at home ...

This year, the BBC (British Broadcasting Corporation) marks 100 years of broadcasting. The first daily radio broadcasts began at 6pm, 14<sup>th</sup> November 1922. TV hadn't been invented then and it was another 14 years until the BBC started broadcasting regular programmes on television. Lord John Reith was the BBC's first boss and wanted broadcasting to be taken seriously. He said that the BBC should 'inform, educate, entertain' - in that order. Before children's television, there was a children's radio programme that began in 1922, soon after the BBC was set up. It was called Children's Hour and was on between 5 and 6 o'clock every afternoon.
