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

Multiply courses can help you to:

To be eligible you must:

- Have the right to live and work in UK
- Be aged 19+
- Live in London
- Not have maths GCSE at grade C (or equivalent)
- Have evidence of 3 years of residency in the UK

Having a good level of maths skills can help you find more job opportunities and lead to higher wages or can help you prepare for further study. They also help in everyday life, for example helping children with homework and budgeting

Launching this year across the UK, 'Multiply' is a new government funded programme to help adults improve their numeracy skills.

If you're aged 19 and over and don't have maths GCSE Grade 4 Grade C or equivalent, you can access free numeracy courses through Multiply to build your confidence with numbers and gain a qualification



We are partnered with the Mayor of London to deliver free Multiply courses designed to fit into your daily life, including evenings and weekends
















Wonderland Arts Week 2023









Our Nursery parents are continuing to come to Nursery to share books with their children. This week, the children loved looking at wordless books and enjoyed talking about what they could see in the pictures.







There have been a small number of measles cases amongst children in Hounslow and neighbouring North-west London boroughs over the last few weeks.

Measles is highly infectious and spreads very easily. The typical symptoms that someone who has measles might show are a cough, runny nose, a rash, sore red watery eyes and a fever. In some cases, the complications of measles can lead to ear infection, chest infection, diarrhoea, can cause fits, and more serious complications of brain infection and risk of death. Anyone who hasn't had two doses of the MMR vaccine is susceptible to catching measles. The risk of more serious complications is increased for those people who are unvaccinated, particularly those who have health conditions that affect the immune systems and for pregnant women.

The best protection against measles for any child or adult is vaccination; two doses of MMR are required for protection. Please check whether your child's vaccinations, especially MMR, are up to date.

Parents and carers who are unsure whether their child is protected against measles can check in their child's Red Book or contact their GP surgery. If a child has missed one or both doses of the MMR vaccine, please make an appointment with their GP for their child to get up to date with their vaccinations. We would also urge parents and carers who think their child has measles to not send their child to school and contact their GP for advice.

Hounslow's parks and green spaces have collected 21 coveted Green Flag awards and are some of the best in London, according to the recent Good Parks Report. If the weather's fine, they are the perfect place to plan a family picnic.

Keen walkers and tree-lovers should head over to the Hounslow Greentalk <u>website</u> where you can create a countryside walk in a matter of moments, simply by typing in a location.

You can also find out more about the borough's 383 different species of trees and where to find them.

Being active in Hounslow's parks is not only good for the body and mind, it can also earn you rewards - thanks to the <u>BetterPoints</u> scheme. By downloading the BetterPoints app, you can earn points by simply going for a walk or a bike ride. These points can then be exchanged at venues including local businesses and Council-owned leisure facilities.

Some of the fun activities in the borough's parks during the Easter Holidays include free nature walks through Boston Manor Park on Thursday, 14, April. You can find the full list of activities at Boston Manor Park here

Other activities include Wildlife Explorers at Crane Park, bug hunting on Hounslow Heath and an <u>Easter special at Bedfont</u> Lakes.
