Now the days are getting longer and warmer, think about walking to school. Why don't you look for signs of Spring on your walk.




Dillon - Green Class- Year 3 took part in a gymnastic competition during the Easter break, this is what he had to say about his adventure

UNIFORM

Beavers is a uniform wearing school and this means wearing a school sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo, white polo shirt and black or grey school trousers, skirt or dress. In summer girls can wear an emerald green checked summer dress and boys can wear grey or black shorts.

Should a child come to school wearing trainers or bright coloured shoes we will be ringing parents / carers to ask for a pair of school shoes to be brought in. Shoes must be sturdy, flat, black school shoes. We will also be ringing if a child is not wearing school uniform.

We also respectfully ask that Hijab's are plain white, black, grey or bottle/emerald green and have no pins.

PE is a very important part of the curriculum and something we value highly as a school. Please help to ensure your child has their PE kit in school, including trainers or plimsolls.

Only children with the Beavers PE kit will be chosen to take part in sporting events and represent the school.

MR. FORGETFUL



Please send your child in to school ready for the school day.

This means drinks, homework, glasses, packed lunches etc are brought in by your child in the morning.

As our school is getting bigger we cannot deliver forgotten items and teachers have asked that we don't disturb lessons. There is a box in the reception area, for you to leave items, but we cannot guarantee the children will get them so please check at the end of the day.

Also please remember that school finishes at 3:15, so make appointments after this time, as it is not always possible to collect children and they are missing valuable learning time.

Children can bring in a piece of fruit and a sipper bottle with water. Please remember we are a healthy school and no flavoured water is allowed. Flavoured water still contains high sugar content and if spilt leaves a sticky mess which can attract pests. Please see this chart showing sugar contents in drinks.



Packed Lunches

If your child brings in a packed lunch please remember to keep it healthy. Try to include some of the following:

- A sandwich or Pasta salad**
- Raw vegetable sticks**
- Fruit**
- Water to drink**

Please remember not to put in any of the following:

- Nuts as we have children with nut allergies.**
- No chicken on the bone**
- No yoghurts—we have no way to keep them cold.**
